

Educational Theatre Company's In-Person Camp Policies

ETC is holding in-person camps for all ages. Parents or guardians are required to sign this document at the time of registration stating that they have read and understood these camp policies.

All camps will maintain the following guidelines:

- Camps will be capped at the appropriate size for the space including ETC staff.
- Camps will be held indoors with an outdoor break.
- All camp sites are subject to change.
- Camper activities will limit physical interaction when possible.
- Parents/Guardians will be given a specific area to drop-off and pick-up as identified by the camp director.
- COVID-19 Vaccinations
 - All ETC staff and campers over the age of 5 must be fully vaccinated for camp. If applicable, ETC recommends that campers also receive the latest COVID-19 booster.
 - Proof of COVID-19 vaccination must be uploaded to the camper's Active account no later than two weeks before your camp begins. Any campers that do not have cards uploaded will have to provide proof of vaccination when checking in on the first day of camp.
 - Students without proof of COVID-19 vaccination will not be able to stay at camp.
 - If the camper becomes eligible for the vaccine during the camp season, the ETC office will work with the family to establish a vaccination plan.
 - If you have already uploaded your child's COVID-19 vaccination card to the system for another ETC program, you do not need to do so again.
- Mask Wearing
 - Masks are optional.

- ETC will provide backup masks for campers and staff if needed.
- If state or county policies change, ETC reserves the right to adapt or adjust policies.

Parent Expectations :

- Families will communicate with the Camp Director ASAP if a camper or any immediate family or household member is exposed to COVID-19 or starts to show symptoms.
 - If exposure happens, families should monitor the camper. If the camper exhibits symptoms, do not send them to camp.
 - If they show symptoms or test positive for COVID-19, they will only be allowed to attend camp after 5 days and showing a negative PCR test result, a negative rapid test result(s), or a doctor's note.
 - For the 5 days of isolation
 - Day 0 of isolation is the day of symptom onset, regardless of when your camper tested positive.
 - Day 1 is the first full day after the day the campers symptoms started.

ETC reserves the right to ask for additional negative rapid tests or mask wearing upon returning to camp after testing positive for COVID-19.

- Families agree to provide masks, water, and any other personal items needed for camp.
- Families agree to abide by all ETC policies, families that do not abide by these policies risk removal from the camp without refund.

If a camper in the camp, or anyone in the camp staff is exposed to COVID-19 or shows symptoms during the span of the camp:

- All families will be notified immediately by the ETC office that there has been a possible exposure.
